

Length of service in the program will equal the amount of time a man would have served in the military, usually 24 months.

"Still He Walked"

He could hear the crowds screaming "crucify, crucify." He could hear the hatred in their voices, these were His chosen people. He loved them, and they were going to crucify Him. He was beaten, bleeding and weakened...His heart was broken, but still he walked. He could see the crowd as He came from the palace. He knew each of their faces so well. He had created them. He knew every smile. laugh, and shed tear, but now they were contorted with rage and anger...His heart broke, but still He walked. Was he scared? You and I would have been, so His humanness would have mandated that He was. He felt alone. His disciples had left, denied, and even betrayed Him. He searched the crowd for a loving face and He saw very few. Then He turned His eyes to the only one that mattered and He knew that He would never be alone. He looked back at the crowd, at the people who were spitting at Him, throwing rocks at Him and mocking Him and He knew that because of Him, they would never be alone. So for them, He walked. The sounds of the hammer striking the spikes echoed through the crowd. The sounds of His cries echoed even louder. The cheers of the crowd, as His hands and feet were nailed to the cross, intensified with each blow. Loudest of all was the still small voice inside His Heart that whispered. "T am with you, my Son", and God's heart broke. He had let His Son walk. Jesus could have asked God to end His suffering, but instead He asked God to forgive. Not to forgive Him, but to forgive the ones who were persecuting Him. As He hung on that cross, dying an unimaginable death, He looked out and saw, not only the laces in the crowd, but also, the face of every person yet to be, and His heart filled with love. As His body was dying, His heart was alive. Alive with the limitless, unconditional love He feels for each of us. That is why He walked. When I forget how much my God loves me, I remember His walk. When I wonder if I can be forgiven, I remember His walk. When I need reminding of how to live like Christ, Ithink of His walk. Mission Moment

Presented by the Missions and Service Commission



Sportsmen Fellowship Ministries, located in Jerome, was started by Rev. Frank Young in 2016 as a place to share his passions with the community as God reveals Himself through various outdoor activities. Through these activities, those who are a part of the ministry help others to have a relationship with Jesus Christ and to live for Him. They presently have about 20 volunteers.

While Sportsmen Fellowship Ministries is not a church, they encourage those who are a part of their program to be connected to a church family where they can grow. They want each member to learn how to use the gifts, talents, and abilities they have been blessed with to further the Kingdom of God. **Their objectives include:** providing religious and spiritual instruction through the outdoors, teaching safety and technique through the proper use of outdoor equipment, and instilling knowledge and ethics through practicing conservation and wise management decisions.

Currently the main focus is on archery, fishing, and pheasant hunts. In 2019, they ministered to over 80 children from 13 school districts in our area. They began this year with this theme verse, "Like arrows in the hands of a warrior are children born of one's youth." (Psalm 127:4) The volunteers see their ministry like crafting arrows to send out into the world. They are working with the children in knowing God personally and making Him known. In 2020, they have already worked with 73 children in advanced archery, have two classes of beginners, and still have a waiting list. They also began archery for teenagers, women, and couples along with children and adult leagues. So far this year, 137 individuals have shot in their facility.

A brief Bible Study concerning what is asked of a Pastor, Deacon and We, The Children of God.

This came to me one night as I could not sleep. My childhood Sunday School teacher, Sally Kaufman told me when you can't sleep or when you are perplexed, grab your Bible. Let it fall open and read. I turned on the light and grabbed a copy of The Living Bible given to me by my parents in 1971. I was only 9 years old. The Bible opened to 1 Timothy, Chapter 3. What a glorious awakening. The following is a chapter of the Bible, listing the requirements of pastors and deacons. Written a long time ago, yet very current, living and breathing. I urge you to continue reading the 1 Timothy Chapter 3 Living Bible Translation that follows and see for yourself if our leaders at Maple Spring fall into those guidelines. Lastly, are scriptures to show how we as Jesus Lovers should live. Be sure to rate your own life. Ouch!

PASTORS

It is a true saying that if a man wants to be a pastor, he has a good ambition.

For a pastor must be a good man whose life cannot be spoken against...

He must have only one wife.

He must be hard working and thoughtful, orderly, and full of good deeds.

He must enjoy having guests in his home and must be a good Bible teacher.

He must not be a drinker or quarrelsome, but he must be gentle and kind and not be one who loves money.

He must have a well-behaved family, with children who obey quickly and quietly. For if a man can't make his own little family behave, how can he help the whole church?

The pastor must not be a new Christian because he might be proud of being chosen so soon, and pride comes before a fall. (Satan's downfall is an example.)

Also, he must be well spoken of by people outside the church—those who aren't Christians—so that Satan can't trap him with many accusations and leave him without freedom to lead his flock. If you doubt this, see me, I would love to tell you a story about Jerome Firehall and our Pastor.

DEACONS

The deacons must be the same sort of good, steady men as the pastors.

They must not be heavy drinkers and must not be greedy for money.

They must be earnest, wholehearted followers of Christ, who is the hidden Source of their faith.

Before they are asked to be deacons, they should be given other jobs in the church as a test of their character and ability, and if they do well, then they may be chosen as deacons.

Their wives must be thoughtful, not heavy drinkers, not gossipers, but faithful in everything they do.

Deacons should have only one wife, and they should have happy, obedient families.

Those who do well as deacons will be well rewarded both by respect from others and also by developing their own confidence and bold trust in the Lord.

In conclusion: 1 Timothy 3: 14-16, I am writing these things to you now, even though I hope to be with you soon, 15 so that if I don't come for a while, you will know what kind of men you should choose as officers for the church of the living God, which contains and holds high the truth of God. 16 It is quite true that the way to live a godly life is not an easy matter. But the answer lies in Christ, who came to earth as a man, was proved spotless and pure in his Spirit, was served by angels, was preached among the nations, was accepted by men everywhere, and was received up again to his glory in heaven.

WE, As Children of God

Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. Ephesians 4:29–32

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. Colossians 3:12–17

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. Proverbs 3:5

Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. Ephesians 4:25

Do all things without grumbling or questioning, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, Philippians 2:14-15

I have to say that some of my expectations of Pastor or Deacons duties were listed and some were not. Here at Maple Spring we have failures but our Pastor and Deacons have scored pretty well on the 1 Timothy checklist. I included 5 simple verses, which illustrate clearly how we are to show the Light of Jesus Christ to the world. If you scored 100% on those,

great! But you better review. I am thankful I am saved by the precious blood of Jesus Christ because my score was…maybe a C+.

I returned to Maple Spring 12 years ago, because for me, it was an extended family of God. A family of generosity, love and forgiveness. I have been saddened over the year that we have failed a test we were given to pass. It is my hope that each member look up these scriptures, read your notes. Allow The Holy Spirit reveal where you are weak and where you are strong. One scripture came to me repeatedly over this study. When they continued to question Him, He straightened up and said to them, "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to cast a stone at her."
