In John 11: 1-44, we read what for many is a familiar passage on the death and resurrection of Lazarus. Verse 35 tells us Jesus wept. So grief is a natural part of our makeup. If you prefer not to submit a picture, we can simply post the name.

*A conscientious objector is one who is opposed to serving in the armed forces and/or bearing arms on the grounds of moral or religious principles. Conscientious objectors opposed to serving in the military are still required to register with the Selective Service System and will be placed in the Selective Service Alternative Service Program. Length of service in the program will equal the amount of time a man would have served in the military, usually 24 months.


