February the month of Valentine's Day and love. What is love? True love? In Hebrew and Greek two words were commonly used in Scripture, those two words are: Apagao and Agape. Both words refer primarily to God's never ending almighty love.

The love of God toward His Son as in John 17:26 where Jesus said: "And I have declared to them Your name, and will declare it, that the love with which You loved Me may be in them, and I in them."

The second way we see this used is in John 3:16 where Jesus said: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.".

I read that love is only known by the action it prompts. Does the love of God prompt us to love others?

- 1.) "God's love is seen in the gift of His Son."*

If you prefer not to submit a picture, we can simply post the name.

*A conscientious objector is one who is opposed to serving in the armed forces and/or bearing arms on the grounds of moral or religious principles. Conscientious objectors opposed to serving in the military are still required to register with the Selective Service System and will be placed in the Selective Service Alternative Service Program. Length of service in the program will equal the amount of time a man would have served in the military, usually 24 months.





Mission Moment

Helping Hands Fund

The Helping Hands Fund was established in 1983 to assist those in the congregation having difficulty meeting financial needs. No cash is ever given; instead, utility, rent, mortgage, and fuel payments are made and grocery certificates are given. There is a \$500 limit a year per member's household and a \$300.00 limit for members of the Community depending on the request and the circumstances of the request. The recipient or household can be given monies for three years in a row and then a year must lapse before a new request can be made. Any changes are at the discretion of the Missions and Service Commission.

The Missions and Service Commission would like to remind the congregation of the availability of the Helping Hands Fund for those in the congregation having difficulty meeting a financial need. Requests for funds should come from the recipient themselves or the Pastor. If you need assistance in meeting a need, please contact a commission member or the Pastor. All requests and assistance are kept strictly confidential. Commission members are: Marge Bittner, Diane Bridge, John Luprek, Karen Nagyvathy, and Christine Shroyer.

The Church Council has approved \$2000.00 to be available in the Helping Hands Fund. When the funds drop below \$2000.00 they are replaced at \$20.00 a week out of the General Fund until the \$2000.00 is replenished. If you would like to contribute to the Helping Hands Fund, envelopes are available at both of the main entrances and can be placed in the offering plate on any Sunday Morning.

Disaster Fund

The Disaster Fund is intended for those who suffer from natural disasters such as fire, storm, and flood damage. The amount given per event is limited to up to \$1000.00 for congregational members and up to \$500.00 for non-members. These funds are limited to persons living in the Somerset/Cambria County regions. Special consideration of increased giving or giving outside the area will require the permission of the Missions and Service Commission.

Three individuals need to authorize the distribution of Disaster Fund money. They are the Disaster Coordinator, a member of the Missions and Service Commission, and one of the following: the Pastor, the Chairman of the Board, or a member of the Finance Commission.

Disaster Funds will accumulate by direct donations and by weekly transfer of funds from the general church giving in the amount of \$40.00 per week until a maximum of \$2000.00 has been reached. In the event that sufficient funds are not available in the Disaster Fund, the Finance Commission will be

contacted to authorize payment.

The current Disaster coordinator is Blaine Leverknight. Recently, there were two fires in our community, one in Conemaugh Township and one in Jenner Township. We would like to commend Blaine and the Finance Commission for assisting the Missions and Service Commission in the rapid response to help these families. Within 24-48 hours monies were approved and these families received financial help from the Disaster Fund. Also, a special thank you to all those who went beyond this to donate clothes, money, physical labor for cleanup, and your many prayers.



PRAY, PRAY, PRAY

There are three great opportunities for us to join with one another in prayer:

- 1. On Sunday mornings at 8:45 we meet in the Pastor's study to pray for the church, for the service, for other prayer concerns. You don't need to sign up, just show up.
- 2. On Wednesday mornings we meet at 9:00 in the prayer room to pray for the joys/concerns placed in the prayer box, along with other needs in the church and community. You don't need to sign up, just show up.
- 3. Every month a list of prayer partners is published in the Water Cup. All you do is pray for your partner, and your partner prays for you. You don't need to send cards or gifts, just pray. Each month the list is updated so you have a new prayer partner. Please call the church office or Patty Shaffer if you would like to be added to the list.

Prayer is the best way for our church to be alive in Christ. Please consider joining in one or more of these opportunities.

Ephesians 6:18 And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints.

James 5:16 Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.
